

After the worst winter in recent memory Palm Sunday is here, which is the beginning of the Holy Week. God gives us the opportunity to walk with his Son during this week starting with his triumphal entrance into Jerusalem, and ending with

his death and resurrection.

We hear today of the suffering servant of Isaiah written many centuries before Jesus Christ came and yet speaking prophetically of him and his passion that we proclaim today. Isaiah reminds us that suffering will open our ear and that Jesus Christ did not turn his face away from spit and suffering. It is a good week to consider if we are willing to do the same; I think I know the answer.

So let us use today and this Holy Week to enter into the passion and death of Jesus Christ. This is the only thing that can help us to make sense of our life. The Fridays of Lent have hopefully prepared us for this, and even if we did not use Lent well this year God comes to help us today. Jesus comes to take away all of our sins and bring us to a place of peace and reconciliation. He is not fooled by the waving of the palms; he knows what awaits him in just a few days, and this is what awaits us also. Let us ask the Lord to help us enter into our cross, into the thing in my life that I cannot accept, and there is where we will find life, a life that never ends. Let us not complain and grumble about what faces us today. Ask the Lord to have the grace to accept our situation in life: priest, married, single, divorced, alone. When we see that this is God's will for us we will find joy. The difficulties remain but someone they no longer matter, when we have Jesus Christ.

Please join us for the Triduum of Easter as we relive the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.



SAINT OF THE WEEK Pope John XXIII

Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli was the fourth of fourteen children born to a family of sharecroppers that lived in a village in Lombardy. ^[2] He was ordained a priest on 10 August 1904 and served in various posts including appointments as a papal nuncio in France, and a delegate to Bulgaria and Greece. Pope Pius XII made Roncalli a cardinal in a consistory on 12 January 1953 in addition to naming him the Patriarch of Venice and the Cardinal-Priest of Santa Prisca.

Roncalli was elected pope on 28 October 1958 at the age of 76 after eleven ballots. No one could have been more surprised with the election than Roncalli himself, who had come to Rome with a return train ticket to Venice. He was the first pope to take the pontifical name of "John" upon election in more than 500 years, and his choice settled the complicated question of official numbering attached to this papal name due to the antipope of this name. Pope John XXIII surprised those who expected him to be a caretaker pope by calling the historic Second Vatican Council (1962–65), the first session opening on 11 October 1962. However, he did not live to see it to completion, dying on 3 June 1963 of stomach cancer, four-and-a-half years after his election, and two months after the completion of his final and famed encyclical, Pacem in Terris.

Pope John XXIII was buried in the Vatican grottoes beneath Saint Peter's Basilica on 6 June 1963 and his cause for canonization was opened on 18 November 1965 by his successor, Pope Paul VI, who declared him a Servant of God. In addition to being named Venerable on 20 December 1999, he was beatified on 3 September 2000 by Pope John Paul II alongside Pope Pius IX and three others. Following his beatification, his body was moved on 3 June 2001 from its original place to the altar of Saint Jerome where it could be seen by the faithful. Bypassing the traditionally required second miracle, Pope Francis declared John XXIII a saint based on his merits of opening the Second Vatican Council on 5 July 2013. He is to be canonised alongside John Paul II on 27 April 2014.^[5] John XXIII today is affectionately known as the "Good Pope" and in Italian, "il Papa buono".

His feast day is not celebrated on the date of his death as is usual, but it is on 11 October, the day of the first session of the Second Vatican Council. He is also commemorated in the Anglican Communion with a feast day of 4 June. It was originally 3 June, but this was later changed.

Dutch Missionary Priest in Syria Shot Dead

A priest helping Christians find shelter in Syria's Old City of Homs has been murdered. Dutch Jesuit Father Frans van der Lugt was shot twice in the head this morning, April 7, by an unknown sniper who killed him while he tended his small garden. Speaking from Syria, fellow Jesuit Father Ziad Hillal said, "Father Frans was apparently killed execution-style with shots to the head. We have received a phone report from a Christian who was with him in the Old City." The 75-year-old Van der Lugt, who had worked in Syria since 1967, had been looking after 89 Christians trapped in the Old City who had sought shelter in an old monastery.

Fr. Hillal spoke with Father van der Lugt, via Skype, from Brussels, and discussed, among other things, the possibility of a modest celebration of the Dutch priest's birthday. He was due to turn 76 on April 10. Fr Hillal said: "For me, [Fr van der Lugt] represents Christ in the world who is willing to lay down his life for his friends, who always gives us hope. He always asks how I am and does not talk much about himself." He added: "He was a ray of joy and hope to all those trapped in the Old City of Homs, waiting for yet another UN permission to evacuate. God have mercy on us, who could not save him from sniper fire." Fr. Hillal also said that at present it is not possible to reach the Old City to recover Fr van der Lugt's corpse.
