

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

I find myself very much like the apostles saying, "Give this woman what she wants and tell her to stop shouting." However, Jesus is very impressed by her faith. Imagine telling someone that it is not fair to take the food that belongs to

the children and tell her that giving it to her is to give it to the dogs? The woman is not insulted, she bounces back and says even the dogs eat the scraps that fall from the table. She means that even gentiles have a right to some happiness, to a few scraps that fall from the table. She persists in her prayer and it is granted: her daughter is cured immediately.

O woman, great is your faith! With what great intimacy Jesus calls her woman who has just gladly humiliated herself to the status of a household dog. Three times she calls Jesus "Lord," in the most polite form. And she is reaping a blessing from him when he calls out to her, O woman, great is your faith. This declaration raises the status of this woman to beloved.

This encounter of the Canaanite woman with Jesus excellently portrays the soul's search for love and healing in God. This search is usually a time of purification. The initial rigor shown by Christ makes the woman fully aware of the depth of her misery when left to herself. His silence and rebuff test the quality of her love and increase her desire for him. Her running, shouting, insisting and humbly adoring are all indispensable exercises that make her heart grow in its capacity for love and joy. Above all, the process is a trial of her fidelity and of her resolute unwillingness to turn to anyone but Jesus for salvation and healing, no matter what is stacked against her. Let us beg the Lord that we will have the same resolve as this woman.


