From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

It is striking how much trust the master in today's parable gives unquestionably to his servants. It never occurs to him to doubt or be suspicious of their devotion. He is almost innocent in his lack of judgment, and there is

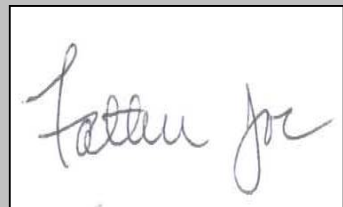
no trace of misgivings.

The parable is asking us ultimately how we live our Christian life while our master is on his journey, before he returns to this earth. St. Matthew is asking us how we look after the Lord's possessions that he entrusted to us in our life. It is much, much more than my talent to sing or cook or organize a party; what am I doing with my life?

God does not deal with us generically, as if we were identical. He loves each of us as if we were the only one present, and he has entrusted to us exactly what is appropriate. When we cooperate with him we share in his own qualities in a way that was not even possible on our own.

It is impressive to see how the first two servants go out immediately to produce fruit. They see the energy of the master and they follow suit. The third hangs back, regresses, and buries his own personhood. He seems oblivious to the fact that all living things require growth, and the cost of not growing is death.

The first two don't worry about how much each one received. Would we do the same? They are only working for the master, and not for themselves, so it does not matter who got five and who got two. The third's chief vice is not laziness but fear of failure. He hesitates, is unready, and is timid. This parable questions deeply the use of our energies since not all work is laudable in the eyes of God. Maybe our business is only to distract us from the necessary interior work that has been neglected for decades. Let us listen well this weekend and not be afraid to give ourselves in some concrete way.
